Flights

1. Depart Aberdeen, EGPD. Collect road traffic accident patient at Wick, EGPC. Transport to hospital at Inverness, EGPE. 144 nm.
2. Inspection of medical facilities. Depart Glasgow, EGPF and fly to Barra, EGPR, Benbecula, EGPL, and Stornoway, EGPO. Return to Glasgow. 285 nm.
3. Transfer patient home. Depart Edinburgh, EGPH. Fly to Sunburgh, EGPB. Return to Edinburgh. 491 nm.

Total 920 nm.

In cargo missions pilots are not required to fly ALL flights.
