Société Aigle Azur Transports Aériens, founded in 1946, is the second largest airline in France. It operates cargo services from four hubs - Paris Orly, Paris CDG, Marseille and Lyon. One of its aircraft became the first European aircraft to land in Baghdad, Iraq after the end of a 20 year embargo.
